About the Park

Ferrymead Heritage Park was established in the late 1960's and was designed to be a museum that houses displays from the many related societies. The park is open to the public 7 days a week from 10.00am till 4.30pm and we have special event days such as Steam Sundays once a month.



Ferrymead owes its importance in history to the hills dividing Christchurch from the port of Lyttelton. Pioneers transported their goods over the steep Bridle Path from Lyttelton to Heathcote, where punts were used to cross the river into early Christchurch. Later traffic came by sea up the estuary.

The Heritage Church

Our beautiful church was built in 1911, as the original Ellesmere Methodist Church, and was relocated to Ferrymead in the 1970s.

Hire of the Heritage Church for the day is \$575.00 for wedding ceremonies and this includes time for a rehearsal at an agreed time.



It can seat up to 90 guests on pews and extra chairs can be added if required. You are welcome to decorate the church in your own style and all we ask is that it is returned to original condition at the end of the hire.

Our restored organ started life in 1894 when it was built and is a beautiful addition to any wedding ceremony. We have a list of suggested organists if required.

The Friendly Societies Lodge

Lodge hire for the day is \$675.00 for wedding receptions and you can use your own catering and decorations to personalise the space to your special day. Access is usually available after 4.30pm the day before however, this is dependent on other bookings.



The Lodge Hall can cater for a wide range of functions with up to 90 guests for a seated meal or up to 120 standing.

Included in the hire of the Lodge is the small kitchen facility which is equipped with a small domestic oven, a fridge, a microwave and a servery with cups and saucers.


90 chocolate brown padded chairs, 10 trestle tables, and 4 fixed tables are available for you to use. There are toilets within the Lodge building, including an accessible toilet.

The Wedding Tram

There is also the added option for your guests to arrive on the Wedding Tram, which would return to pick up the bridal party. This is a fantastic photo opportunity and a unique way to arrive at your ceremony.

Our Tramway Society will provide a driver and conductor and within the time, you are welcome to use the tram for photos at locations around the park.

If you would like to add the Wedding Tram, this is an additional \$160.00 for 2 hours hire.
